

“Life is a great big canvas and you should throw all the paint you can on it.”



Deworming for STHs aimed to reduce the worm burden in populations and decrease the intensity of infection, particularly among heavily infected children, since morbidity was more likely among those with high-intensity infections. As part of the program, a single dose of Albendazole chewable tablets was distributed to students from Nursery to UKG. The Albendazole tablet was given to school children in the presence of the class teacher on February 19th, 2025.

- Emphasis on regular attendance and homework practice.





The meeting strengthened parent-teacher collaboration, ensuring better learning outcomes for students.
