"A new day signifies a new beginning."

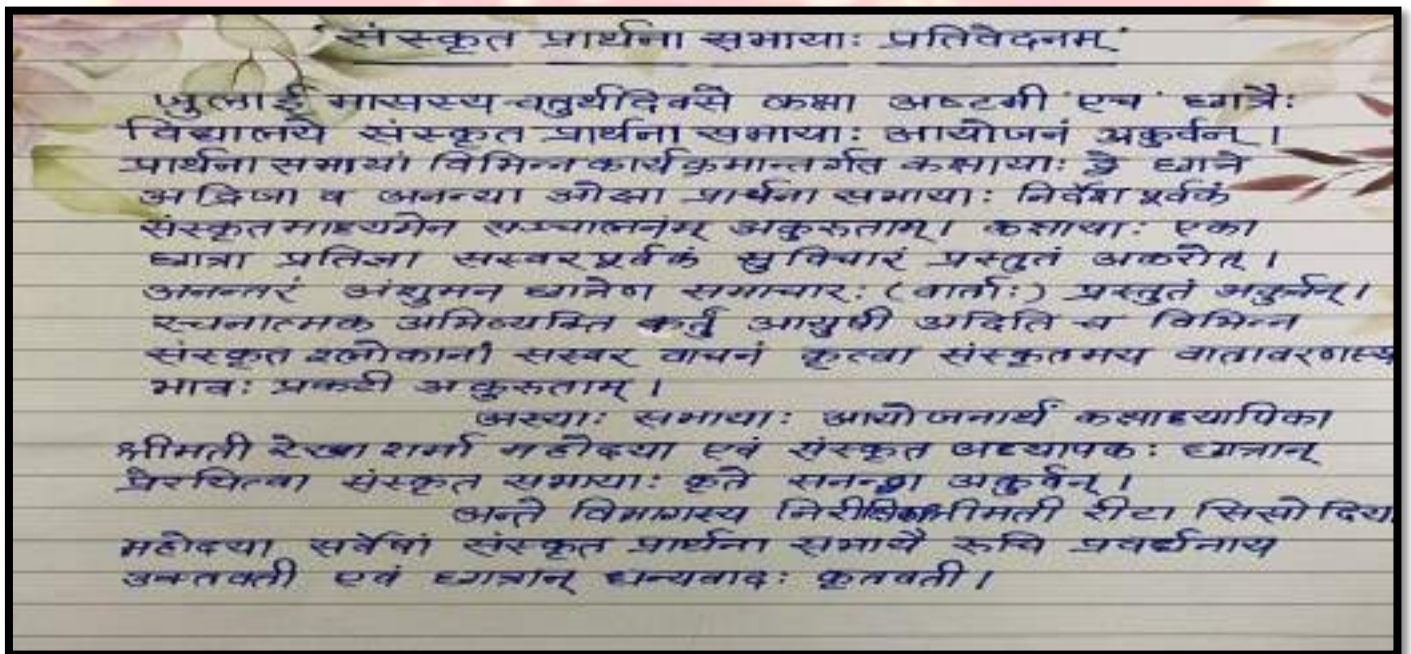

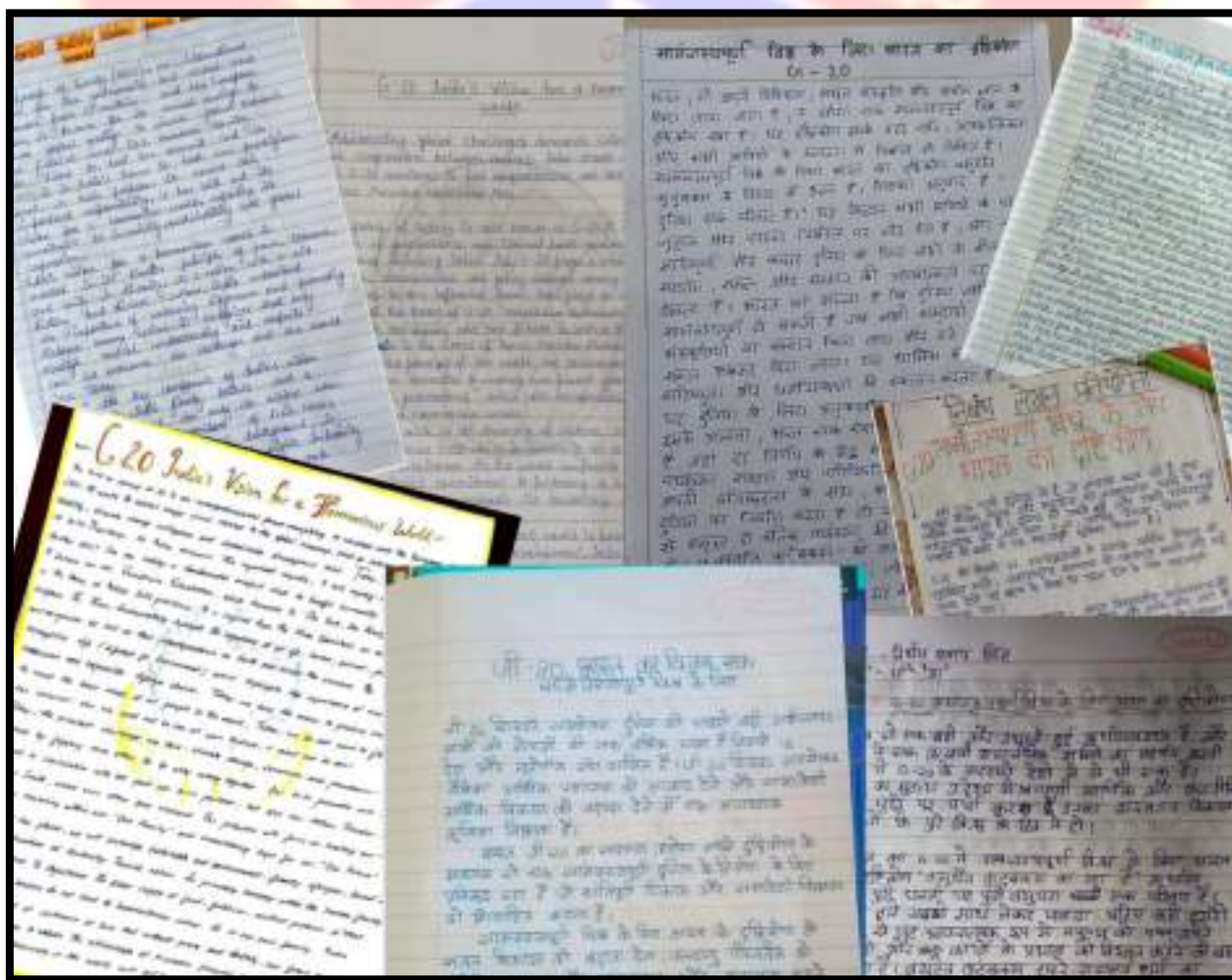
ESSAY WRITING COMPETITION

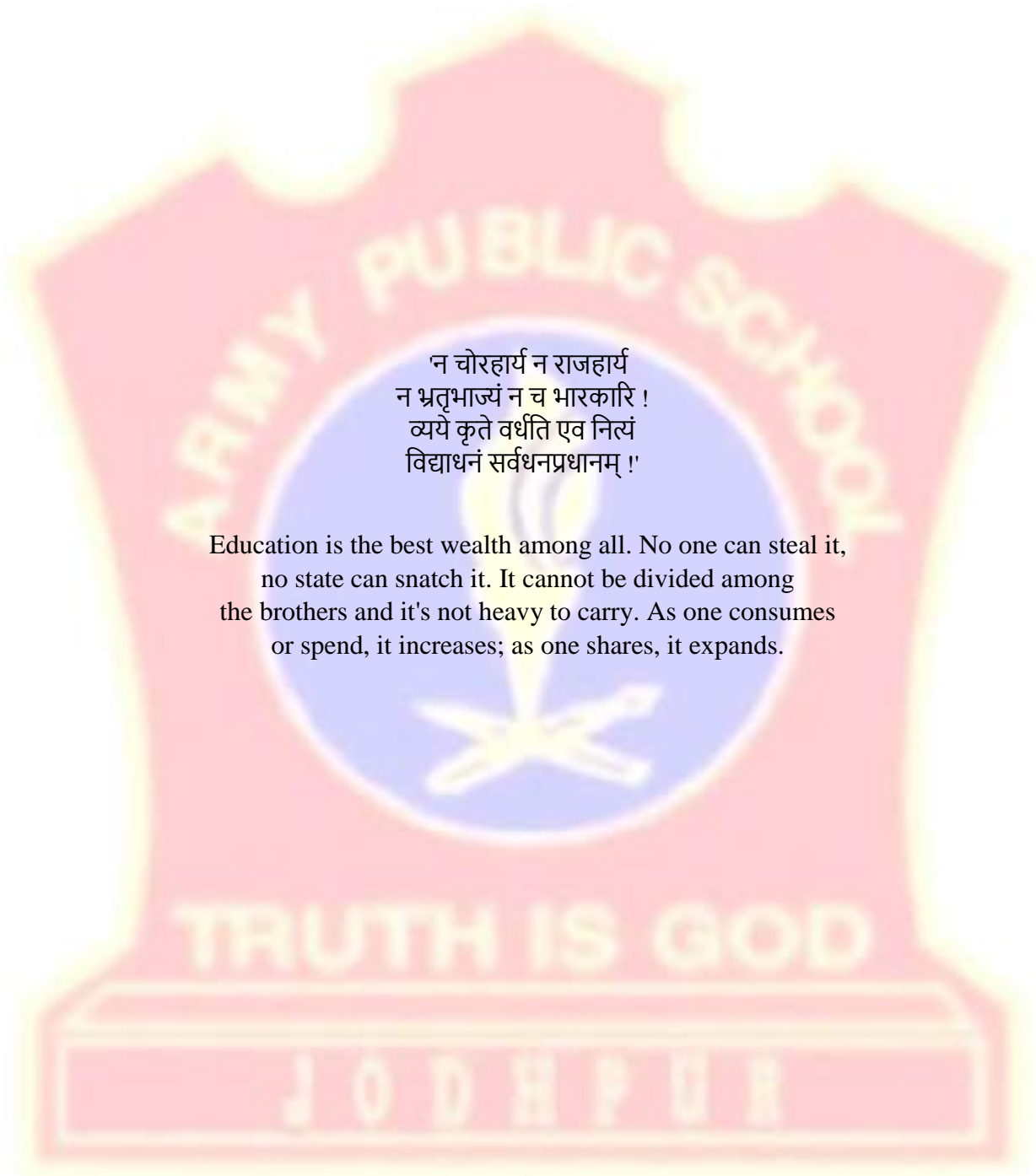
