## COMMENDATION FROM C.O.A.S



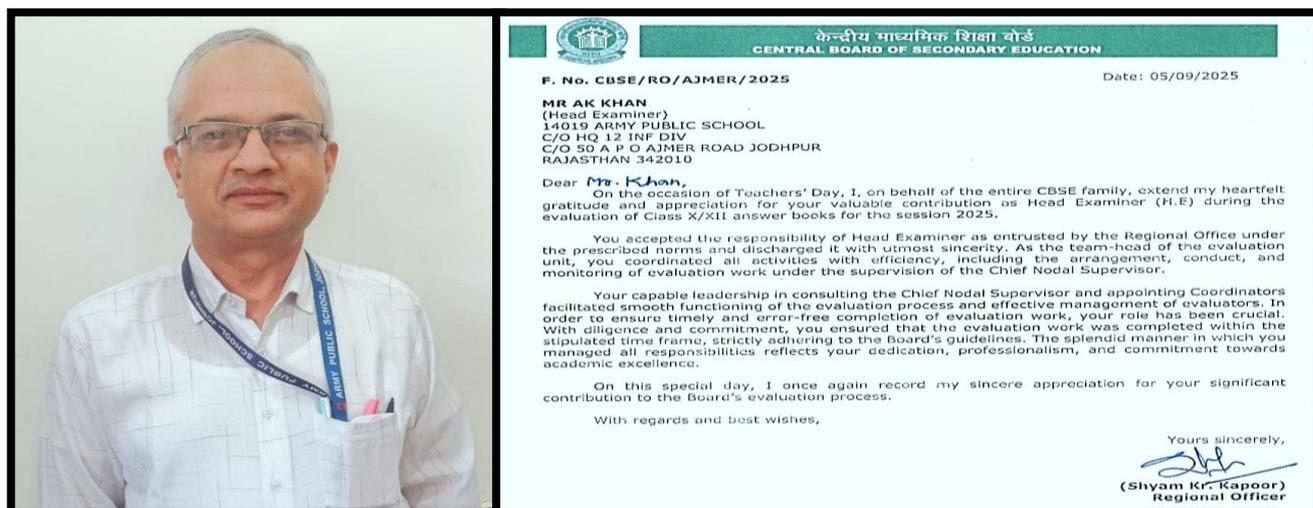

## EID MILAD-UN-NABI CELEBRATION



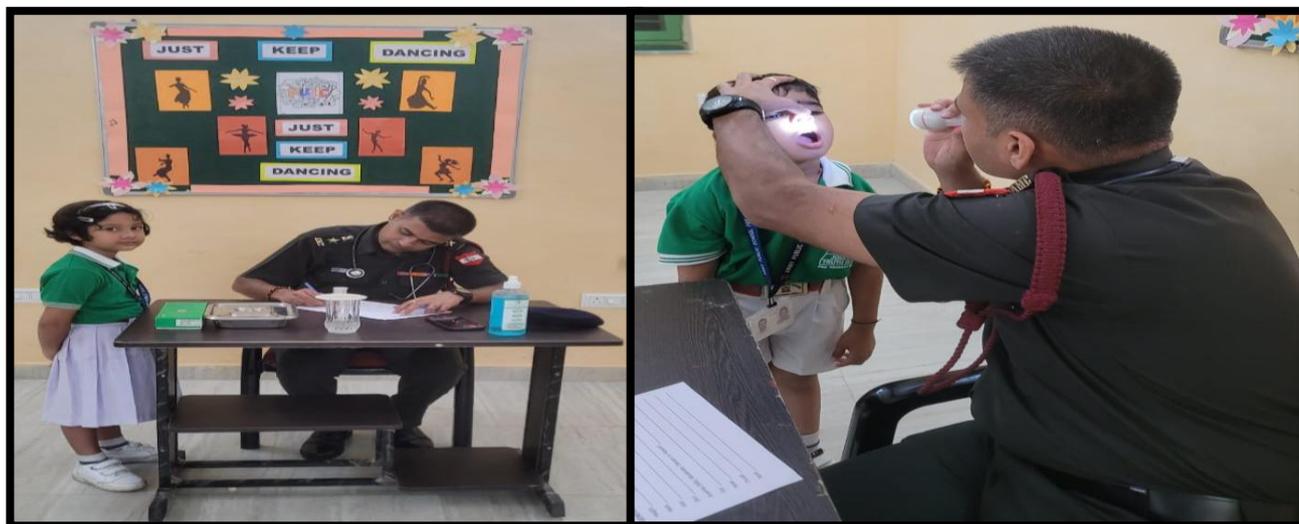

### VISIT TO SHIKARGARH SPORTS COMPLEX



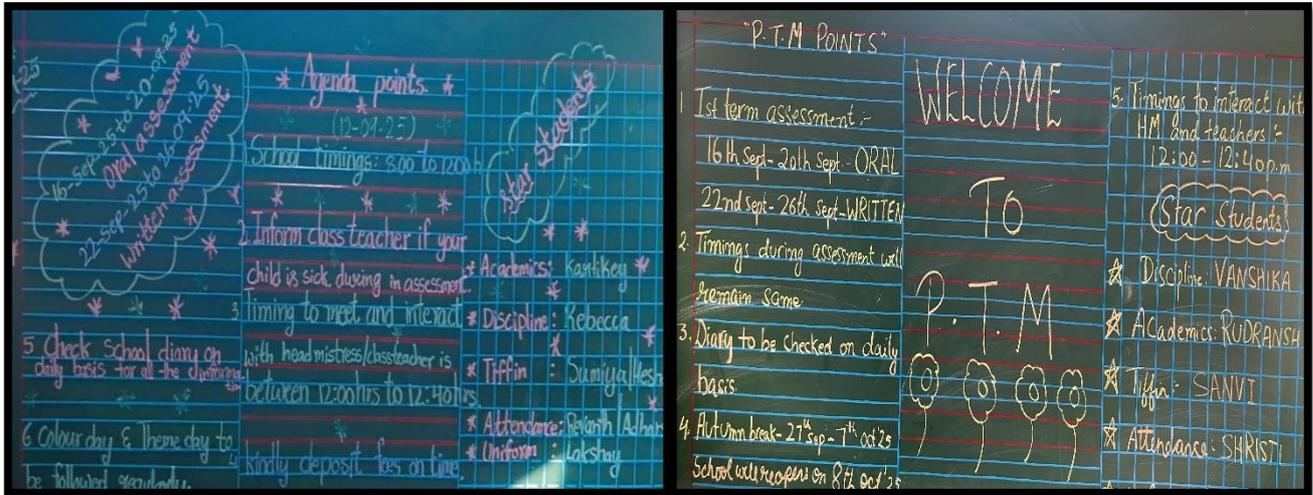
