# GLIMPSES



## SAMC MEETING

A meeting of the School Administration and Management Committee (SAMC) was held on January 9<sup>th</sup>, to review key administrative, academic, and infrastructural matters concerning the school's development and functioning.

The committee approved the installation of firefighting facilities, hiring of contractual electricians, clearance of pending dues, and approval of non-budgeted projects. Progress of the PPW-II building construction and plantation work was reviewed, with directions issued for regular monitoring and timely completion. Approval was also granted for the demolition of the PPW building with reimbursement of materials, along with plans for improved utilization of school infrastructure.

Important academic and administrative decisions included approval of a 10% annual fee increase, review of transport facilities for Air Force students, measures for disposal of unusable furniture, and reinforcement of proper infrastructure maintenance. The committee also discussed matters concerning EPF coverage for teachers, possible salary revision for non-teaching staff, and initiation of the selection process for the new Principal.

In concluding remarks, the Chairman Management emphasized focused preparation for the upcoming Board Examinations, directing schools to strengthen student support through progress tracking, parent interaction, and additional academic assistance. The meeting concluded on a positive note with appreciation for the school's successful conduct of major events and overall financial management.

## INLAND LETTER WRITING ACTIVITY
